THE EXHIBIT PURPOSE

This exhibit purpose is to show how the Admiral issue where used to pay for the different postal services which were available during the period, which included a lot of rate changes, many stamp and colour changes and new postal services.

BACKGROUND

The background to the new issue with George V, was the dead of his father Edward and that this issue had to be replaced.

The design is from a portrait of the King in full dress uniform of an Admiral of the fleet, provided the necessery detail of the uniform, orders and decoration. That explain why this issue is called **The Admiral issue**

Besides the Admiral issue stamps during the 1912-28 period are also included the War Tax stamps, provisionals 2c on 3c, the 1917 3c Confederation stamp, the first Special Delivery stamps and the first Air Mail stamp. During the Admiral issue there was a lot of colour changes to follow the UPU regulation. For example the First Class Letter stamps to UPU-countries were issued in three values, 5c, 10c and 8c blue.

The possible combinations to pay the various rates are almost without limits


All the shown items are different in one way or another, rates and different postal services, colour of stamps, destinations or combination of stamps.

RATES

Postage rates and the period during which the rate were valid are given in the upper right corner of each page, as far as possible. Otherwise along with each object.


CONDITION & RARITY

Items of more interest and/or rarity are either called rare/scare and marked with red letters or red frame.




"Returned for Postage" and "Returned for War Tax" was applied, then a crayon "4" was added on the top of "Returned for Postage", indicating that 4 cents Postage Due had to beepaid by the recipient. It however was sent to the Dead Letter Office where it was cancelled (backstamped) "Branch D.L.O. Oct 1 1915 Toronto" where the 2 cent Admiral stamp was put on and cancelled "Branch D,L,O, No 2 Oct 4 Toronto".

Paris Station was a separate Post Office until 1940 when it became a Substation of Paris, so the letter is shortpaid 1 cent to pay First Class Letter rate.



The fee was collected on delivery. Only the single deficiency in prepayment is to be collected, the defficiency in this case not being doubled.








Drop Letter, Montreal Oct 19,6 AM, 1920 P.Q. sent local.

Pays the 3 - 4 ounce Drop letter rate (2 cent first oz + 1 cent each added oz) together 5 cent.

Pay the rate with a WAR TAX stamp intended for Fiscal use. Rare

The 5 cent Admiral stamp issued solely to pay War Tax on Wiens and Spirits. Confusion arose and the Post Office authorised their use for postage on April 16 1915. On May 20 Postmasters were instructed not to accept them and postage due would thereafter have been charged, but not here. Few were postally used.

These card are advertisements, printed on the fronts of regular issue postcards, for the money orders sold by several of the express companies.

The cards were usually sent out by a local express office to inform individuals or buisnesses of the arrival of an express shipment for them.

Rate was the same as for Postcard, 1cent each.



In July 1 1926 the War Tax was abolished, but the rate remained 2 cent.






"Lathework" or engine-turned design was transferred to the bottom of the plates for the post office sheets, six different types were used.



CASH on DELIVERY came into operation at Money Order Offices on Oct 1 1922. Prior to this C.O.D. was operated like this example by the CANADIAN NATIONAL EXPRESS Co.

This envelope was attatched to the goods for Charles Chapmanat, Bracebridge, Ontario. On delivery the 25 dollar was collected and that amount in a Money Order was sent from Bracebridge on the 23rd March 1922 in the envelope provided to N.Smith, Belting, 138-140 York Street, Toronto, Ontario





C.O.D sent by the DOMINION EXPRESS COMPANY for N.Smith Belting Toronto to W.J.McKinnon Snow Road Station, Ontario June27, Amount of Bill Dollar 5.28.

Unless instructions to the contrary are written by shipper on package and also on C. O. D. envelope, charge for collection and return of proceeds will be collected from consignee. INSTRUCTIONS: Unless otherwise instructed by shipper, a C.O.D. package must not be opened or delivered until invoice is paid. A C.O.D. package must not be forwarded beyond original destination unless by special instructions from agent at shipping office.
If C. O. D. matter is refused or cannot be delivered within 48 hours, notify shipper at once (Form 186) and if not disposed of within 30 days after such notice it may be returned to shipper subject to conditions of receipt issued for the shipment and collection of charges both ways, unless shipper requests further time. Under no circumstances must it be held longer than 60 days. Perishable property, if refused by consignee, must, in the absence of instructions, be sold immediately to best advantage, for account of owners.
Shippers' Instructions on C. O. D. Package, Envelope, or Invoice Must be Strictly Compiled With. Unless directed to remit cash, Agents must issue Money Orders in payment of C. O. D.'s of amounts of \$200 or less, and send direct to shipper by Post Office mail, using this envelope. Shipper's name and address on reverse side. Goods waybilled from. TORONTO, OANADA.

Cash on Delivery came into operation at Money Order Offices on Oct 1 1922.

It was to be in effect at Money Order Post Office and on
Rural Routes starting from Money Order Post Office.

After June 15 1923 C.O.D. delivery service was extended to all post offices in Canada.





1/2 cent Business Reply Card, Montreal P.Q. Sep 4 1928

The 1/2 cent Business Reply Card rate was first introduced and published in the Canada Gazette of April 12 1924. The rate was to be 1/2 cent per business reply card that was send out as an enclosure with any matter addressed to any place in Canada.

They were mailed out in lots of 1000 or more and could only be used to prospective Customers, not for existing or regular customers.

After WWI, the Post Office allowed the Militia Depertment to use precancancelled Admiral stamps to send out medals to discharged soldiers.

Most Public Department was free of Canadian postage including Secretary Milita Council, but in Jan 1920 thise privilege was cancelled.





In 1921, the AR paper form was replaced with a card (se next page) The AR fee was increased to 10 cent if the card went forward at the same as the letter. If the card was sent after the letter was mailed the fee was 20 cent. The AR card was to be signed by the addresse and the postmaster at the receiving office. The card was dated at the receiving office and returned to the sender at the point of orgin.

Mail to Asia there were two major routes via Vancouver/San Francisco to Japan, Shanghai, Hongkong, Australia and New Zealand. The other way was via Montreal/New York to London and then via different European countries to destination.

Mail to Africa. Routes depend on the destinations was West or East Africa and the flag of colonial powers.

Mail to Middle East went either via Egypt under British control, or the Ottoman Empire via Constantinopel.

Mail to West Indies, Central and South America. Halifax to Bermuda and unward to Carribien, From Montreal via New York to Carribien, Central and South America. One other possibility was via New Orleans to Carribien, Mexico and Central America.
