### Early Mail and Stampless Letter Postal Markings of Sweden

### **Synopsis**

As a marcophily exhibit, this study tells the story of Sweden's early mails and their postal markings. The earliest mail was delivered by messengers (couriers) and normally does not have handstamp markings. Following the messenger mail is the Crown Post for official mail that was in effect from the 17<sup>th</sup> century until 1874 when official postage stamps were introduced. Thus several systems of mail existed in parallel use rather than sequentially.

The General Mail was established in 1636. The first handstamp markings were the crown over B (Betalda or paid) and the crown over F (Fribrev or free letter). The first place-name cancellations were undated and consisted of STOCKHOLM enclosed in a ribbon. These are shown chronologically from internally dated contents and known periods of use of the varieties. The normal straight line town name cancels in capital letters are presented alphabetically and again are dated by letter contents or periods of known use.

The exhibit continues with the same treatment of the arc cancels (year date in curved format) followed by the rectangular or box cancels. The latter two are dated and again are shown alphabetically by town name with periods of use indicated. With all three categories—straight line, arc, and box cancellations—a complete showing would be impossible with the limited number of frames. The examples shown are lesser known towns and less common varieties. In a few cases auxiliary manuscript notations are mentioned, e.g. "urgent."

The next section shows examples of Free Letter (Fr Br) handstamps followed by postage due markings. The final frame takes a look at foreign mails to and from Sweden with their associated postal markings.

What the exhibit does not include—the Circle Cancels, with year date in horizontal format, which began during the pre-stamp period, are not shown as they are extremely numerous. The exhibit does not show rate and route information since the focus is on the postal markings. The exhibit reflects over 50 years of study and acquisition by the exhibitor.

#### **Treatment**

Overall the approach is to show the markings that were used somewhat chronologically. However this cannot be done literally as there were different mail systems used in parallel and the periods of use of types of markings overlap. The types of markings are the over-riding differentiators.

#### Importance

Sweden is an important Nordic country with a rich postal history. The evolution of stampless mail postal markings in all the Nordic countries is interesting and those of Sweden are somewhat complex with many types and varieties.

#### Philatelic Knowledge

Most of the literature in this field is in the Swedish language, offering a challenge for the exhibitor to obtain and understand the many sources.

#### Rarity and Condition

The material is generally not found outside Sweden and was mostly obtained from Swedish dealers and auction houses. Key pieces are noted with boxed text. Most surviving stampless mail has held up well over time due to the high fiber content of the paper.

## Early Mail and Stampless Letter Postal Markings of Sweden

This marcophily exhibit tells the story of postal markings used in Sweden, primarily before the introduction of adhesive postage. The time period is from the 17<sup>th</sup> century to the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, although some examples of stampless covers extending into the 1860s are included. This study explores the early types of mail including messenger mail, crown post, military mail, and general mail. Some manuscript markings are also identified. Key items have boxed text.



## Crown Post or Mail (Kronopost)

The Crown Post consisted of communications sent by royalty or government officials and dates from the 17<sup>th</sup> century until 1873 when official correspondence was taken over by the General Post Office. The mail was identified with hand drawn crowns (usually three) and later with handstamp crown markings. The manuscript notation evolved into three or more curves or loops with a line drawn through, sometimes referred to as a coil or meander.





Stampless folded letters that have one corner turned to the back indicated the mail was that of a commoner rather than royalty or the clergy. Both covers bear crown marks. The top one was sent to Räfvalofta January 27, 1834. The bottom cover was sent December 23, 1841 to a gamekeeper in Landskrog. Its lower right corner was originally folded back as shown by the crease. Manuscript "Angeläget" or "Urgent."

### The General Mail

Sweden's General Mail was established in 1636 by Chancellor of the Realm Axel Oxenstierna during the reign of Queen Christina. The remaining sections of the exhibit are groupings by subject, generally in chronological order within each group. The general mails are usually recognized with handwritten charter numbers in the upper right corner of the cover. These numbers represent listings of the letters in the records of the postal service.



## The B & F Crown Markings

From 1686 until 1708 the General Mail used two basic types of handstamps, consisting of a crown over a capital B (Betalda or paid) or over a capital F (Fribrev or free letter). Within the types are subtypes that differ in shape (oval vs round) and in the dimensions.

## Stockholm Ribbon

Sweden introduced place name cancellations in 1708 in Stockholm. The name appears in a sort of banner with curved ends known as a "ribbon." A variety of the ribbon markings were used from 1708 to 1751. The exhibited items have the year of use where documented, followed by the known range of use.

### **Straight Line Cancels**

The cities and towns of Sweden received the new straight line cancels in capital letters beginning in 1819 (see following section). The exception was Stockholm, which began using this type of undated cancel in the 1750s. Over the years a number of varieties of the Stockholm canceller were used. Dates of use are shown in parentheses.

### Straight Line Cancels - 1819-1830

In 1819 Sweden introduced stronger undated straight line cancellations with the town name in capital letters. They were used until 1830 when they were replaced with the Arc cancellation. Folded letters or covers that contain actual dates are noted.

The first <u>dated</u> cancellations of Sweden began to appear in the latter part of 1830. They consisted of a single circle with the town name, the month and day in the lower center, and the year numerals placed in curved format on both sides of the month/day numbers. This distinguishes the cancellation from the later Circle cancelers that had the year date in horizontal format. In some cases the Arc cancels were used as late as 1869. The specific periods of use for each cancel are shown.



By the mid 1830s when the Arc Cancellations were being widely used, a new type of dated handstamp postal marking was adopted to replace the Arc design. The first box (rectangular) cancels were introduced in 1830 in Stockholm for Free (official) Mail. The new box cancels, with their bold easy-to-read town names in capital letters and the more legible dates, were gradually sent to the town and city post offices to replace the Arc type. These cancels are also found on covers bearing postage stamps from 1855 on. The Box cancels remained in use in some cases into the 1860s.

## Semicircular Nyköping

Many free letters were simply marked in the lower left Fr Br for Fri Brev or Free Letter. However, several special cancels with the FR BR abbreviations were used during the 1850s and 1860s. This one in semicircular design was used at Nyköping from 1823 to 1833. Two undated letters to Göteborg and Fahlun.



### Postage Due Handstamp Markings

Postage due handstamp markings in Sweden began in the 1850s except for the Obetalt (Unpaid) marking applied at Helsingborg for mail coming in from abroad that was paid only to Denmark. In the 1850s and beyond, handstamp due markings were used locally in Stockholm, for steamship mail at Uddevalla, and in various denominations of skilling, riksdaler and öre, primarily on unpaid mail arriving from abroad.


