

# The King Carl XVI Gustaf & The Queen Silvia

## Definitives 1974-1997

**Carl XVI Gustaf**, King of Sweden, ascended the throne at age 27 on the death of his grandfather, King Gustaf VI Adolf, on 15 September 1973. King Carl XVI Gustaf was born in 1946. His father, when Crown Prince, was killed in an airplane crash in 1947. The King is the longest reigning monarch in Swedish history. **NOTE:** 15th September 2023 the King **celebrate His 50th anniversary** of ascending the throne. The first denomination 75 öre was delivered 24th April 1974.

**Queen Silvia** of Sweden is consort to King Carl XVI Gustaf. As Crown Prince, the King met his future wife at the 1972 Summer Olympics in Munich. The Queen was born in Heidelberg, Germany. Together, they have three children. Both King and Queen are fluent in several languages.

In 2011, Silvia **became the longest serving Queen of Sweden.**

Following tradition in Sweden, the monarch is typically depicted on the definitive stamps. This series of stamps with the new King was initiated in 1974. In 1981 the Queen was added to the definitive series – **a first for a reigning queen-consort.** All together, between 1974 until 1997, 42 denominations were released in the common format perforation 12. The King has shown an interest in philately and was the Patron of STOCKHOLMIA 2019.

Preceding the King's ascending to the throne, Czeslaw Slania (1921-2005) became the Royal Court Engraver of Sweden already in 1972. All designs on all 42 denominations were made by him, the master engraver.

### Treatment

Each value is contained in its own section, each of which starts with an easily identifiable introductory page; All perforations are shown; First days uses; Deliveries; Mail uses. During this period of postal operations, the special Saturday Delivery of mail was in operation from 1978 until 1987, treated in a concluding and exciting section with intended usage. Special attention is given to the study on the booklets of Carl XVI Gustaf Type I (1974-1980). New denominations coincide with the introduction of new rates. As a traditional philately treatment, intended uses are extensively represented with its correct franking, very many of them far more difficult to find than you believe they are.

[For the sake of clarity, all rates are given in "öre". Kr = Krona. 1 Kr = 100 öre]

### Print Editions

Since the 1930s, the Stamp Department of the Swedish Post Office offered collectors subscriptions to all print editions (deliveries) - so called "shade study subscriptions". Until 1 January 1981, this subscription service was free of charge, but thereafter the service was charged an extra fee of SEK 100 annually, and the minimum scope of a subscription was one strip of five. From 1 January 1986 the scope was further limited to definitive issues only. The treatment presented herewith, reflects this service, by including all print editions until the service was terminated in 1988. The print editions presented derives from an original subscription. The shades are often not readable for the eye, but in some limited deliveries its possible to categorise by shade with a letter and a color combination.

- Postal card rate to all destinations,, Surface rate on postal cards to all destinations
- Airmail postal cards to destinations outside Europe, To nordic destination.

The difference between the printings are the dates and sometimes gum and paper of the delivery. The [dates] are common to the [delivery] of the possible [shades].

# Booklet Panes

Control Numbers  
Back Print

In the time-period 1974 to 1980, when the King Carl XVI Gustaf Type I definitives were issued, two printing presses were in operation: The 1st and 2nd Goebel Presses. For machine-made booklets, the perforation was done directly in the press with a specially built-in perforation unit. When perforating stamps for booklets of the usual type with two rows of stamps, the perforation tool must be designed so that the center perforation occurs in the margin only between every other stamp row and, moreover, horizontally between each stamp.

The booklet blocks were fashioned in a right-hand manner in the booklet cover, that is, with the King's main image facing up.

## Registration Marks

The function of the Registration Mark is to align perforation and cutting. The Registration Mark is a vertical line which is cut into the plate midway between every other row of stamps line. It shows up on the outer edges of the margin and directs the cut between two booklets, it is called a **Separation Registration Mark**.

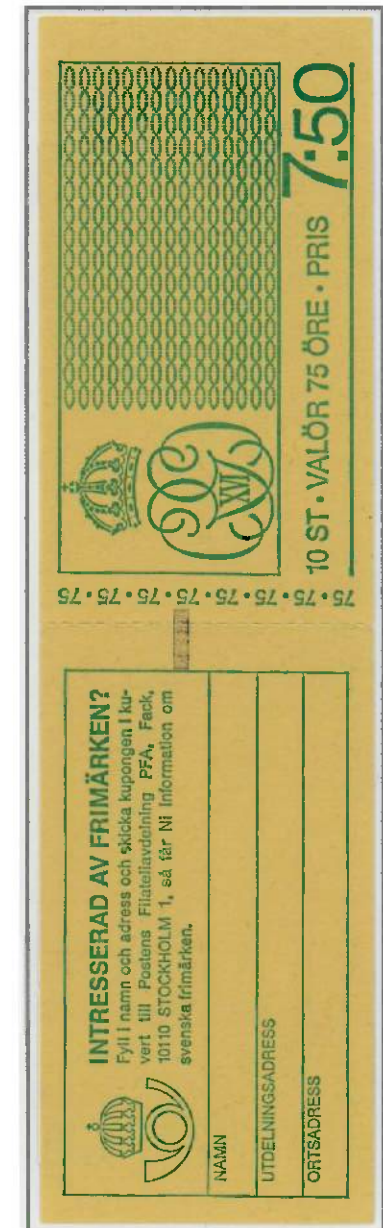

## Control Numbers

**Control Numbers** were always printed in the margin by a special control counter built into the stamp press. The numbers are presented inversely with five digits. The number is printed at every twenty-stamps row in the production of stamps for coils, and for booklets with two rows of stamps. This means that the control number can be found in **every 10th booklet** and is used for

checking the number of stamps printed. As for the 1st Goebel Press, the control number appears in **antique style** and for the 2nd Goebel Press it appears in **block style**.

## Back Print

On **each of the 50th booklet** covers, a so-called **Back Print** in black color was printed, to facilitate the bundling of fifty booklets.

# Booklet Panes

## Cylinder Numbers

### Cylinder Numbers

In order to be able to locate the different rows of stamp images on the endless full-cast steel cylinder, **Cylinder Numbers** are stamped or embossed on it. The cylinder figure is presented in the stamp margin and is always placed more or less midway between two stamp rows. They are printed in the same color as the stamps. A cylinder turn takes up 17 booklet panes,

which means that one cylinder number will be complete and the other divided into two booklet panes. In booklets with King Carl XVI Gustaf Type I definitives, **Cylinder Number 1** is divided and **Cylinder Number 2** is complete, both always occur with the back of the figure facing the stamp design.

The 100 öre denomination exists in two versions: A) Coils in vertical separation for sideways delivery in rolls of 100 and 500 stamps.

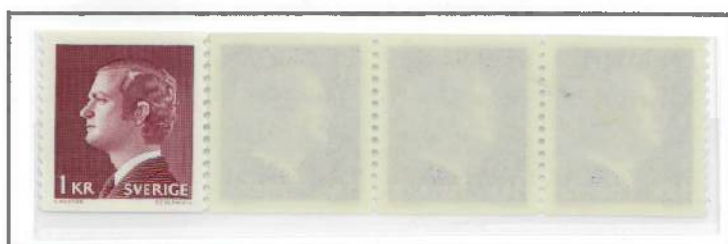

Already in 1967, the Swedish Post Office began occasionally printing stamps on a paper with fluorescence as a result of an acquisition of a new mail sorting-machine with a photocell. The new machine recorded the fluorescence on the stamp and then turned the letter correctly,

thus facilitating the cancelling by the machine. On subsequent two printings, one was made on a paper with yellow fluorescence, and the other without fluorescence.

The **Separation Registration Marks** shows up on the outer edges of the margin and directs the cut between two booklets. **Control Numbers** are presented inversely with five digits and can be found in every 10th booklet and is used for checking the number of stamps printed. As for the 1st Goebel Press, the control number appears in 1 antique style (not applicable for the 150 öre denomination) and for the 2nd Goebel Press it appears in 2 block style. The Cylinder Figure is presented in the stamp margin and is always placed more or less midway between two stamps rows.

A cylinder turn takes up 17 booklet panes, which means that one cylinder number will be complete and the other divided into two booklet panes. In booklets with King Carl XVI Gustaf Type I definitives, 4 Cylinder Number 1 is divided and 5 Cylinder Number 2 is complete, both always occur with the back of the figures facing the stamp design. On each of the 50th booklet covers, a so-called 3 Back Print in black color was printed, to facilitate the bundling of fifty booklets.

# ⑩ 1978—1987 · The Saturday Delivery Service

For a long time it was a matter of course that arriving mail should be sent to the addressee as soon as possible. Sunday distribution of mail was abolished as early as in 1951, and from 1 September 1978, the general Saturday delivery of mail in Sweden was also abolished.

At the same time, it was introduced that for a special fee some mail was forwarded on Saturdays - the so-called **Saturday Delivery Service**. This service was in operation from 1 September 1978 until 28 March 1987.
